NORTH V SOUTH: UNSW CANBERRA WOMEN'S CHALLENGE

The best women's players in the UNSW AFL Canberra First Grade Women's competition will go head to head in the North vs. South Challenge, bringing a light-hearted rivalry for Canberrans onto the field.

The North side is made up of players from Ainslie, Belconnen and Gungahlin with the South taking players from Eastlake, Tuggeranong and Queanbeyan. This is a great opportunity for the league to showcase the amazing talent it has on offer, pinning the best of the best against each other for the first time.

The South will be boosted by having Jackie Parry lining up for the Southsiders. The Tiger is easily the most dominant forward in the competition, kicking 28 goals across the first four games this year, including a bag of eleven against Gungahlin in the first round of the competition. Parry is coming off of a four-goal outing against Belconnen last weekend and will be full of confidence heading into the match, look for her to be lighting up the forward 50 for the South.

Amber Allen lined up on Parry for the Magpies last weekend, and proved to be a good match up, will the North's jack of all trades go to her again? Allen will be a key figure for the North, as will stalwart of the competition Rosie Bink who will be looking to experience her first win for the season holding down a key position. Expect to see Teagan Hawke winning the hard ball on the inside, getting out to the clean hands and huge tank of teen prodigy Emily Pease. Keep an eye out for Emily and a number of other players who are still eligible for the CareSuper Rising Stars Women's Competition. The opportunity for these young players to experience training and also game day with the top end athletes of the First Grade Women's competition will be truly special for them, as they look to continue their own journeys in Football.

AFL CANBERRA V RIVERINA FNL

The AFL Canberra squad will be looking for three wins in a row when they face the Riverina Football Netball League. The Canberrans won this match up last time they met in 2017, taking advantage of an inaccurate Riverina side to run out victors by 40 points. Followed up by a convincing victory over Black Diamond in 2018.

But the Riverina boys are back to have another crack, bringing with them an abundance of talent including well known players to Canberra Jordan Iudica and Will Griggs as well as Ex Canberra Demons ruckman Nathan Richards, who will also feature as he returns to the nation's capital since his move back to the Griffith Swans. Goal scoring machine Marc Geppert has had a fantastic start to the year for Collingullie Glenfield Park and will be looking to continue this with his partner in crime John Buchanan up forward.

A strong side is expected to be selected for the home side with the likes of Belconnens Beau Walker leading the charge as captain of the team. There is a slight Riverina feel to the Canberra side, with a number of the players previously plying their trade in their local competitions. Daniel Jordan, Lachlan Highfield and Stephen Camp in the Farrer FNL, whilst former Wagga Tiger, now Queanbeyan Tiger, Campbell Lovell, will be looking to impress against a number of former team mates as he pulls on the Blue and Gold for AFL Canberra.

Eastlake's Ben McGinness in good form heading into the match. McGinness has featured in the Demons best players the last three games and should be a prominent figure in the midfield for the Canberrans. It should be a great game with plenty of skill on offer with clear skies forecast, showcasing the high level of football the two regions have to offer.

WHO HAS IMPRESSED YOU ON THE TRAINING TRACK: Our younger brigade definitely put there best foot forward keen to impress at our first training session with Emily Pease (belc) and Ellie Bishop (Ainslie) showing some great form.

WHO IS THE DANGER PLAYER FOR YOUR OPPONENTS: The strength of the Northside will definitely be driven by its midfield. Having 12 midfielders between the 3 clubs nominate will certainly give us the upper hand come game day.

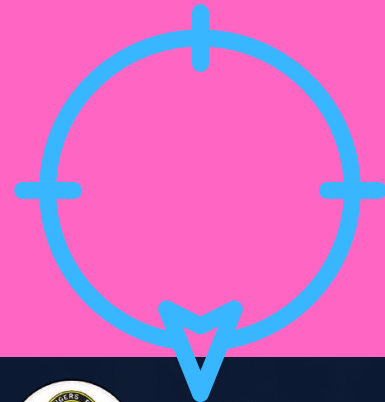
